


Who are LiNCHigher?




What we do

- Support 45 secondary schools across Lincolnshire with Information, Advice & Guidance to Higher Education pathways.
- Outreach activities for students in Year 9 -13. Many focusing on key skills relating to
 - Confidence
 - Endurance & perseverance
 - Goal mapping
 - Self belief
- Specific focus on students from under represented backgrounds including BAME, WWC, FSM, Disability
- Community groups including GRT, Children in Care & Service families
- Growing number of special schools

- Preparation is key to a successful transition to HE
- Use our tool kit to facilitate conversations about HE early on with your child, so you understand the pathway and the local opportunities.
- Identify your young persons specific needs, and evaluate your higher education options and the individual provisions of each institution. – Not all are equal.
- Engage with the HE provider early on to effectively prepare i.e.
 visits or early start programmes
- If progressing to Level 4 or above, EHCP is discontinued. Apply for disabled students allowance (DSA)
- Identify applicable bursaries and financial support, national and University level.


